Course Overview

Target Audience

The School Library Basics Learning Pathway is intended for new Ohio school librarians or Ohio school library staff who have not completed a graduate program in library science.

Prerequisites

To successfully participate and complete the activities in this Learning Pathway, participants must have experience in the following:

- A general knowledge of their library setup and a basic understanding of how libraries function.
- Using basic website navigation and technical knowledge of web-based applications such as creating an online account, managing information, and selecting settings.

Introduction to INFOhio

Learn more about INFOhio, Ohio's PreK-12 Digital Library, available at no cost to Ohio students, parents, and educators. This class will help participants identify the resources and tools on the website and navigate the site easily. After passing a quiz, a certificate for two contact hours is awarded. (2 hours)

Advocacy: Sharing the Value of Your School Library

Learn about the importance of advocacy and how to locate organizations and resources to assist with advocating for your school library, as well as learn how to increase your library's presence and foster communication with your community. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 hours)

Fetch

Learn about Fetch, INFOhio's basic online catalog search. Fetch is a simple web-based library catalog and includes a visual search, reading program search, and advanced search options. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 hours)

Collection Development

Learn the skills necessary to develop a collection that is up-to-date, accurate, and relevant for students and teachers. After completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for three contact hours. (3 hours)

Information Literacy

Learn about information literacy, the structure of an information framework, the resources to build information literacy, and tools to build information literacy into your communication and curriculum for students. After successfully completing the final quiz, earn a certificate for two contact hours. (2 hours)

Grades/Evaluation

This pathway is worth eleven contact hours. Completion of each class is required to earn the full eleven contact hours. The pathway and its classes are not currently available for graduate credit.

2 Contact Hours



Class Description

Participants in the Introduction to INFOhio class will learn more about INFOhio, Ohio's PreK-12 Digital Library, available at no cost to Ohio students, parents, and educators. This class will help participants identify the resources and tools on the website and navigate the site easily. After passing a quiz, a certificate for two contact hours is awarded.

Class Objectives

Participants in the class will achieve the following ten objectives:

- Identify the vision and mission of INFOhio.
- Understand the four services INFOhio provides for Ohio schools.
- Understand the authentication process used for Ohio access to INFOhio digital content.
- Successfully change log in accounts based on location when accessing INFOhio digital content.
- Navigate the INFOhio website to find the content you need.
- Understand the different types of searches on the INFOhio website and the results you will get for each.
- Identify INFOhio's resources that provide digital content.
- Identify INFOhio's web tools for teaching and learning.
- Locate INFOhio's support page for questions or concerns.
- Understand how to stay connected to INFOhio via email, newsletter, or social media.

- Develop strong search skills.
- Learn how to create customized access to Fetch to fit the needs of students, teachers, and parents.
- Learn how to create a widget, button, or link for ease of access.
- Learn how to find Fetch statistics.
- Identify best practices for using Fetch in the classroom.
- Reflect on learning by sharing information with others.

- Understand how conducting an inventory can help maintain a library collection.
- Reflect on learning by sharing information with others.
